Pine Island Chamber Seeks Establishment of Library

PINE ISLAND—The Pine Island Chamber of Commerce will seek the establishment of a public library for the community as its next project, according to action of a chamber meeting Monday night at the Polish Legion of American Veterans Hall.

President Alfred Roy told members that chamber officers will investigate the possibility of raising city and state funds for the purpose. He said it was quite possible that temporary quarters are could be obtained at the Pine Island Elementary School. There are several rooms in the school not being used at present.

A committee will be appointed at the March 5 meeting of the group to work on the project.

President Roy also mentioned that a history of the

Pine Island area will be undertaken. He asked the members to contact all elderly persons in the area for old pictures and items relative to the development of the rural-land farming area.

Members also voted to have the Pine Island Lighting District Committee serve as the Lay Advisory Group to the Warwick Town Board. At a public hearing last month the Warwick Town Board accepted the possibility of the district.

President Roy said representatives of Orange and Rockland Utilities will attend the March 5 Board meeting to discuss the light district.

At present only three of the 67 street lights are erected, these having been installed as samples last fall. Also to be determined is the billing to the residents of the district. There is no budget allotment in the present Town of Warwick budget for the lighting district. A system of deferred payment will have to be arrived at, it was indicated at the meeting.

Members of the Lay Advisory Group on lighting are: President Alfred Roy, Edward Gerczak, Daniel Gerlitz, Sylvester Krasniewicz, Vincent Krasniewicz and Bernard Bierstine.

In other actions, it was voted to request the Warwick Town Highway Department for repairs to the Liberty Corners Road. This road, now in a state

of disrepair, leads from Pine Island to Sussex, N.J.

Warwick Town Councilman John Brodzowski Jr. told members of the impending civil service examination for Warwick town police. As a first class town, Warwick said, the Town Board can abandon the town police system in favor of the town police system. He said the pay scale and benefits had not yet been decided upon by the board.

However, he added, probably two members of the town police would be chosen from the five sections of the town, and urged that residents of Pine Island take the test. Member Vincent DeRosa was named to keep abreast of all activity pertaining to the establishment of a vocational school in Orange County.
